After only one year there is no doubt this was a necessary and needed addition to the community.

Also, our mission to 'reach the kids that need us most' continues in our newest project. Over a year ago, we took over the operations of the Project Solution property on Bresson Avenue in Reno. Currently, we are exploring options to convert this property into a Boys & Girls Club. While much work has to be done, this facility has the potential to have the same impact on its community as the facility on Foster Drive. Please look for future information on how you may be able to help with this much needed project.

With the start of the new school year upon us, we are excited to change gears back to before and after school programming. We take our role of educational support for the Washoe County School District very seriously and are looking forward to helping kids complete their homework, organize their back packs and be prepared to go back to school every day.

## Fundraising Campaign: It Just Takes One



It just takes ONE person to make a difference in the life of a child. Will you be the ONE?

Our annual board-driven fundraising campaign raises community awareness of the work that the Boys & Girls Club of Truckee Meadows does

and raises the funds necessary to continue to provide services that promote the health, social, educational, vocational, character and leadership development of the youth we serve. The Boys & Girls Club has changed the lives of young people in our area for almost 40 years. We are incredibly proud of our history and plan to reach even more children and communities in the next decade. To continue this critical and lifesaving work we need the support of the community to invest in our most precious resource – our children.

Families pay an annual \$20 membership fee for their child to attend the Boys & Girls Club. We provide before and after school programming and full-day programming during WCSD school breaks, for \$40 per week. If a family cannot afford the fees, we offer financial assistance. No child is ever turned away for financial reasons.

Club membership gives children access to a safe and affordable place to go with adult supervision. The Club is a place filled with caring-trained staff and volunteers, character-building educational and recreational programs, warm healthy meals and opportunities to set and achieve goals all while having fun. It costs \$2,646 per child to provide a year of high-yield learning activities and programs at the Club. In 2014 the Boys & Girls Club of Truckee Meadows served 13,000 youth and 65% of those families earned incomes of less than \$40k per year. Our fundraising campaign is essential to bridge that gap and to keep the costs to families low so we can continue to reach those who need us most.

It is only with the support of community-minded individuals like yourself that we are able to invest in the future of our young people and transform lives for a better tomorrow. Every donation – no matter the size – is important and truly appreciated. It just takes ONE person to make a difference in the life of a child. You can be that ONE.

## Vintage Eldorado event supports Club



The Eldorado Resort Casino and Southern Wine & Spirits is presenting Vintage Eldorado, an Italian wine and food pairing event, set for 5:30 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 8 in the Eldorado Convention Center. Guests must be 21 or older.

Attendees will be treated to Italian food stations, domestic and imported Italian wines, Italian beer and spirits and a silent auction benefitting the Boys & Girls Club of Truckee Meadows. The tasting stations include items like Eldorado's famous mushroom ravioli with porcini cream sauce infused with truffles; Italian cheeses including Grana Padano, Mozzarella di Bufala and Robiola di Roccaverano; antipasto including marinated grilled vegetables, roasted red peppers with goat cheese, olives, fettunta (garlicky crusty bread) and eggplant bruschetta. Guests will also find Piedmontese New York strip "Tagliata" garnished with pecorino creamed spinach and saba caramelized cipollini onions; heritage Berkshire porchetta with sea salt and olive oil focaccia; and wild jumbo prawns simmered in a Sicilian sauce flavored with tomatoes, pine nuts, currants, capers, fennel pollen and marsala wine. Dessert stations will be filled with Italian sweet treats such as affogato (espresso poured over hazelnut gelato); classic tiramisu; chocolate-almond cake from Abruzzo glazed with bittersweet chocolate; cannoli; and meyer lemon bars.

Vintage Eldorado benefits the Boys & Girls Club of Truckee Meadows and kicks off the 34th annual Eldorado Great Italian Festival. Set for Oct. 10-11, the festival includes a grape stomp, sauce cookers' competition, free live entertainment on two outdoor stages, an Italian farmers market, children's gelato-eating contest, wine walk, Italian food street-side and an Italian buffet inside the Eldorado. Special this year, Paul Anka is performing at 8 p.m. Oct. 10 at the Silver Legacy's Grande Exposition Hall.

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## Summer Brain Gain keeps kids on track



What happens to kids over the summer? Each summer in America an estimated 43 million children in the U.S. miss out on expanded learning opportunities that could prevent them from falling behind. During summer, most youth lose about two months' worth of math skills. Low-income youth also lose more than

two months' worth of reading skills, while their middle-class peers make slight gains.

Summer learning losses can stack up from year to year, causing low-income children to fall further and further behind, ultimately endangering their chances of high school graduation. More than half of the achievement gap between lower and higher-income youth can be explained by unequal access to summer learning opportunities.

Boys & Girls Club of Truckee Meadows is committed to ensuring that area youth, especially those who need us most, graduate from high school on time with a plan for the future. That's why we, in collaboration with Boys & Girls Clubs of America (BGCA), launched Summer Brain Gain—a summer learning loss prevention program developed specifically for Boys & Girls Clubs that allows our organization to integrate educational activities into our traditional summer schedule.

Summer Brain Gain is comprised of one-week modules with fun, themed activities for elementary, middle and high school students. Supported by Disney, each module takes a project-based learning approach: youth engage in a process of learning through discovery, creative expression, group work and a final project or production. A large emphasis of each module incorporates elements from STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) education that are appealing and interactive for members. As a result, kids develop higher-order thinking skills through the Summer Brain Gain modules while staying on track for the coming school year.

The Reno Tahoe Winter Games Coalition (RTWGC), dedicated to promoting the Olympic Movement throughout the region, has hosted an Olympic Day Sports Festival for each of the past five years and sees the partnership for this year's event as the next step in the evolution to reach more of the area's youth.

## Parents benefit from Give & Receive Program

Most of the parents participating in this program are volunteering above and beyond their hours, as one parent said, "I love helping out this organization because this organization has helped me tremendously, and it's the least that I could do."

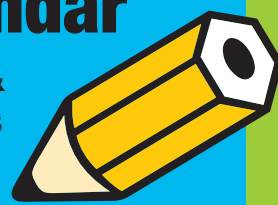
more than 10 million connections with kids.
